As a part of our marketing campaign, having received a warm invitation from the Ahmadiyya Senior Secondary School, Kissy Dockyard, Freetown, a small team from our College visited the above institution on the Day of Graduation of the school on July 30, 2011. Being a major school in the Capital, more than 2000 members including the students and their parents/guardians attended that colourful function. Sr. Hamlet and Dr. Sam were given the opportunity to participate. Dr. Sam addressed the gathering which met in a huge mosque owing to the sudden heavy showers, and introduced the activities of our College, to a thunderous ovation from the audience.





The End-Semester Examinations came to a close on Aug. 8, 2011. All the examinations were held on time as per schedule, and went on without any hitch whatsoever. The Supplementary Examinations were held on August 16-18, 2011

Most of the answer scripts have already been valued and the valuation work is going on as per schedule in the Seminar Hall. Only two more subjects remain to be valued at the time of filing this report.

There is a ray of hope for receiving electricity supply in the course of the coming months as the imported electric posts have already been planted right up to the Kunsho River.

The High-level water tank being constructed in front of the College by the government under the auspices of an UNESCO programme has been completed. Currently, we are waiting for its connection with the city water supply scheme.

It was announced in the UNIMAK Management Committee Meeting that a bus has been given to the University as a whole, and that this bus service will take care of the transportation needs of our staff and students in the mornings and the afternoons.

The construction work on the Kitchen-cum-Laundry building for the Student Hostels is nearing completion and the work on the College Canteen is in full swing.

A meeting of the College authorities with Parents/Guardians and Students has been scheduled for August 29, 2011, in order to explain to the letter, the need for completing four years of study for all Degree courses, as per the conditions required by the Tertiary Education Commission of Sierra Leone

As we are awaiting the WASSEC results, we are confident that we will emerge as the natural choice as the venue of study with many students, thanks to the goodwill the College enjoys already amongst the public, thanks to its track record and marketing campaign.

## DMI-St. John the Baptist University, Malawi.

On 4<sup>th</sup> August 2011, a three members' team from ministry of education visited our University and had a thorough inspection. Mr. Herman came from Tanzania for this inspection.

On 6<sup>th</sup> August, one of our students Mr. Gerald Kasamba from 2<sup>nd</sup> group of Pre-University had passed away due to accident. We offered mass on Sunday in our church along with all our students, parents and relatives of Gerald. And University remained closed on 8<sup>th</sup> August for the mourning and sisters, father, staff attended funeral service along with our students in his home town.









Bridge course students had their CAT II from (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>) August and Model Exams (9<sup>th</sup> -13<sup>th</sup>). We communicated their parents about their exam performance and attendance percentages through the communication letters. Based on their exam performance and attendance we displayed the student's lists of eligible, detained and who had to make up their attendance. Finally 119 students sat for their end examinations.

Entrance exam for the second intake has been conducted for the students in our University campus. 36 students were sat for their exam. Among them 23 students were selected for the Preuniversity and some of them are eligible for the Bridge course and some of them are eligible for direct entry.

Students from bridge have finished their final exam and pre-university students have finished their CATIII

Faculty Development Programme (FDP) has been organized to improve the teaching skill and counseling skills of the staff.

We have fixed 9 hose reels in the campus for the security purposes.
