- The College offers two courses namely B.Com, (Commerce and Accounts) and B.Sc (Computer Science). We have 28 students in all and 6 members of the teaching staff and 6 non-teaching staff.
- We have held the first End-semester exams and completed the valuation of the answer scripts with help of our own staff.
- The College is scheduled to re-open for the Second Semester on the 28th
 March.





Periodic Radio Programmes are regularly organized over Radio Maria, Makeni, as a part of our marketing strategy for the coming academic year.

On Saturdays we go on air on well-prepared, lively broad casting programs under the title **DMI-ST.JOSEPH COLLEGE**, **USHERING A NEW ERA IN TECHNICAL EDUCATION**. The staff and students actively participate in the one-hour programme, often eliciting interesting and valid comments from the radio audience.

The Resident Minister of the Northern Province visited the College and the newly-constructed Hostels.

The College and Hostels receive streams of visitors from time to time who evince a keen interest in the academic programmes on the cards of the College in the coming year. This augurs well indeed for the growth of the College in the coming academic year.

The newly-constructed Hostels of the College meant for the accommodation of 200 students, a timely legacy from Rev.Fr.Pietro Reginelli, a Xavarian priest from Italy.

We are constructing a 50 room hostel for our college boys and girls. The construction will be over by the end of this month. 200 students can be accommodated for the next academic year.

We had conducted first entrance Exam in Malawi on 26.02.2011. The total number of students who wrote entrance exam- 385. The exams were conducted in various places namely
